
This newsletter is the last before Easter so I wanted to remind you all of what Jesus did and how he understands us. I love how the writer of this article puts it and hope it encourages you too .

'Jesus experienced fear and anxiety about what lay before him. The Bible says he was "sorrowful and troubled" (Matthew 26:37). But in this moment of suffering and struggle, Jesus prayed. He prayed to God, his Heavenly Father, "'Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done' ... And being in anguish, he prayed more earnestly, and his sweat was like drops of blood falling to the ground" (Luke 22:42, 44).

Heartbreakingly, God did not stop the suffering. Instead, he gave Jesus the strength to endure the path to the cross, and God watched his son die. This was part of God's greater plan of redemption for the people of the world who he loved so much.

Many of the emotions that were there on Good Friday are similar to those we experience today. There is nothing you can experience today that God has not seen before. Friends who betray and reject us. Fear and anxiety over financial insecurity and sickness. Pain and heartache for loved ones. Confusion and hopelessness about the future. Grief, despair, loneliness. Jesus understands all of it.'

We have had a great term in the library, with many children borrowing some of the many new books we purchased at the end of last year.

In the holidays, many, many hours were spent in the library rearranging the room to make it more appealing and organised. We were able to purchase 5 new shelves for our junior fiction section so that all the books were easily seen and chosen by the students. Using these new shelves, we have been able to create a nice little reading nook for the classes.

The borrowing rate has increased for most of the students, and it has been great to see not so many children having overdue books.

Next term we have a few exciting things happening, not the least of which will be the National Stimulus Story Time on May 25, where the book being read is *Family Tree* by Josh Pyke and Ronojoy Ghosh.

Scholastic Book Club is continuing to be a great source of books for many students. From each order, the school earns points and is able to put these points towards more books. It is a fantastic way to help us stock the library with the most up-to-date reading materials. Thank you to all the families who support us in this way. We are no longer accepting cash for these orders; you will need to order them online via the Scholastic “loop” link. All the information can be found in each catalogue.

We look forward to another wonderful term in our school library.



### It's Music time

This term, all our primary classes have been focusing on their class song for the school musical. I am sure you were impressed with their singing and movements when watching The Not-So-Terrible Parable. Many of the actions were thought up by the children to represent what they were singing. We have had fun working on these songs and perfecting them.

Towards the end of term, the Yr 3/4 & Yr 5/6 classes have begun to create some of the decorations for the library, whose theme this year is 'Music'. We hope to get these finished and start to decorate the library with them. These classes have also been working on reading the notes on the staff. We commence each lesson with a quick quiz about the names of notes, how long each is played and how to read them. Many of the students are increasing their PB (personal best) each week. Some of the students have reached the point of achieving 100% most weeks. This will continue next term but will begin to get a little harder.

In the two older classes we will be working on more practical enjoyment in music next term, while the K/1/2 class will move into songs and finger plays.

## High School happenings...



In Year 7/ 8, we started with numbers, understanding Roman Numerals, Hindu- Arabic and Chinese in numbers. All students had great success in learning about these numbers.

In Week 3, we started with Basis Algebra, simplifying algebra expression with like terms. I was impressed with the response from the students. They were working well.

The number that makes an equation true is called its **solution**.





As you move up a thermometer, the temperatures are getting hotter.

We moved on to solving simple equations. From Week 4, the students were taught how to solve various types of equations in Stage 4 and proceeded into written statements in equations. The work became increasingly harder, but the great thing was that the students worked hard and rose to the challenges!



In Year 7/8 Science, we started with a safety guide to the science lab and learned how to name lab equipment. We experimented with flame colors and the different types of elements. We increased our knowledge in this and learned analysis skills.

By Week 3, we were studying the Interaction between organisms in ecosystems. And from Week 5, we were studying elements, particles, state of matter, chemical and physical properties using the periodic table. Students really enjoyed this study and carrying out experiments. This also broadened students' understanding of how nature is related and dependent on each other.

Year 9 /10

We started with revision work from Stage 4. In week 2 we worked on fractions, percentages and decimals and by Week 4, we started with Basic Algebra and moved on to simple expression and solving equations.



For Science, Year 9/10 were taught about development of the atomic model by several scientists in the early 19th century.

Eg: Rutherford's model of atoms - Studies of atoms and their masses, Isotopes and arranging electrons in shells.

In Weeks 5 and 6, Year 9/10 studied radioactivity elements, carbon dating, types of nuclear radiations and effects of radiation. From week 7, we moved on to the history of the Periodic Table, organising elements, atomic structure, and properties - this leads to the balance of chemical equations in chemical reactions.

The Year 9/10 students enjoyed participating in experiments and answering questions in the se areas.



25 years ago, when the first School Board was looking to appoint the founding principal, they were seeking an exceptional person but the confirmation came in an unexpected way!

After two years of planning and much prayer, without finding a suitable candidate, the deputy principal at Taree Christian School advertised that he and his wife had a vision to found a Christian school, so the SMCS Board excitedly invited them to Cooma. After the visit they declined the appointment, believing that God was leading them to Queensland. Very disappointed, the Board went back to praying.

One Sunday morning at church, the then pastor, Kevin Carlson, asked me to send a fax to our applicant, making a second request that they might reconsider. I was very reluctant as they had been so definite that they were not coming to Cooma. It was a busy day getting lunch for our family and getting back to a Church Family Meeting that afternoon. When we arrived, Kevin immediately asked if I had sent the fax and I indignantly pointed out it was Sunday and as the fax would be going to his school, he wouldn't receive it until tomorrow but Kevin was so insistent that I said I would send it when we got home. Against my better judgement, I sent the fax later that day but was shocked when less than ten minutes later, the phone rang and an excited Geoff Wainwright declared: "I received your fax!" Feeling guilty for sending it, I was blown away by what came next! He said: "I was at the School picking up some things and walked past the fax machine and saw your message. What you don't know, is that when Gail and I said 'no' to Cooma, we laid a fleece before the Lord and said, '*Lord, if you mean for us to go to Cooma, they will ask again!*'" The rest is history.


